#### WHAT IT MEANS TO YOU AND YOUR CLIENTS



#### **KEY DEADLINES:**

- January 22, 2018: Travelers residing in New York, Louisiana & Michigan will not be able to travel with only their STANDARD state driver's licenses.
- October 1, 2020: Every air traveler will need a REAL ID-compliant license, or another acceptable form of identification, for domestic air travel. To check whether your state is compliant or has an extension click here.


If the traveler cannot provide an acceptable form of identification, they will not be permitted through the security checkpoint. TSA does not require children under 18 to provide identification when traveling with a companion (who has proper ID) within the United States.

#### WHAT ARE ACCEPTED FORMS OF ALTERNATE ID?

- U.S. passport
- U.S. passport card: the passport card is an alternative that will allow travelers from noncompliant states to board a domestic flight; it will not be valid for international air travel. Passport cards are the same size as a driver's license, cost \$55 for first time applicants, and \$30 for anyone who already has a passport.
- DHS trusted traveler cards (Global Entry, NEXUS, SENTRI, FAST)
- U.S. military ID (active duty or retired military and their dependents, and DoD civilians)
- Permanent resident card
- Foreign government-issued passport
